



**CONTEXTUAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE SCHOOL, INCLUDING CHARACTERISTICS OF THE STUDENT BODY****Values and Underlying Principles**

Lutheran Schools across Australia share common values. These values build and contribute towards the ethos of each Lutheran School. The following values reflect characteristics of God and God's will for all people and underpin the life of Our Saviour Lutheran School.

Our School Values are Truth, Connectedness, Curiosity and Service. Each of these Values are a focus throughout the academic year, discussed and explored with students within class, at assemblies, class meetings and devotions.

At Our Saviour, we know that a sound understanding of Literacy and Numeracy are crucial for student progress and self-esteem. We place a strong emphasis on these throughout the primary years with dedicated and extended Literacy and Numeracy time, as well as intervention programmes and extra staff who offer additional support.

The way teachers present the curriculum has a significant impact on student achievement as well as their enjoyment of learning. From Foundation to Year 7, teachers at Our Saviour present the curriculum in keeping with the inquiry-based learning model of the Primary Years Program of the International Baccalaureate.

Our Saviour Lutheran School (OSLS) is a school of the Lutheran Schools Association of South Australia, Northern Territory and Western Australia, a member school of Lutheran Education Australia and a school of the Lutheran Church of Australia.

OSLS is an authorized school of the International Baccalaureate Organisation Primary Years Program and provides an affordable and holistic education that educates the whole child - intellectual, emotional, physical, and spiritual. OSLS provides specialist areas in Drama, Visual Art, and German, with many extra-curricular activities offered.

### **Characteristics of the Student Body**

OSLS is a stand-alone day school where many children live in close proximity to the school and are brought to school by their families or caregivers by car. The school provides an Out of School Hours Care service through YMCA from 7am until school starts and then after school until 6.30pm.

OSLS has an inclusive enrolment policy, taking preference to siblings of students currently attending the school, families who are active members of the Lutheran church of Australia, students transferring from another Lutheran school and families who desire a Christian upbringing for their children.

Children come from a range of backgrounds, some of which are from migrant families or first-generation Australians. On completion of their primary education, OSLS students move in largest numbers to independent and government schools, with approximately a third moving to local schools within the same council area for Secondary school.

### Teacher Standards and Qualifications

All teachers at Our Saviour Lutheran School meet full accreditation requirements for the Teacher's Registration Board of South Australia, wherein part of that registration process is that they undertake training in first aid, mandatory notification and hold a current National Police Certificate.

At OSLS, in addition, all staff participate in a three-year cyclical program of in-house training in mandatory notification and Valuing Safe Communities (LEA program) fire safety, and first aid refresher courses including asthma and anaphylaxis training. Our teachers are also required to complete their accreditation to teach in Lutheran Schools.

Learning support here at Our Saviour continues to be an area that greatly impresses prospective families. This is a strength of our school where students individual learning, social and emotional needs are recognised and valued. Currently we have 1 in 5 students identified as requiring an independent Learning Plan (ILP) Mrs Sharon Greenham, our Inclusive Education Officer, works tirelessly alongside our teachers to ensure that each child in our school has maximum opportunity

for experiencing success with their learning. Students can have diagnoses including Dyslexia, ADHD, Executive Dysfunction, Sensory needs, fine and gross motor dysfunction, Anxiety, Depression, Autism Spectrum, or vision and hearing impairment. This can be challenging for our staff; however, we are blessed to have teaching and support staff, along with volunteers that willingly advocate for each child here at Our Saviour. Intervention can take the form of in classroom support and adaptation to curriculum requirements, through to small group, one on one support and specific intervention programmes being delivered to students in need. Further commitment to addressing the needs of young children, we have invested in a trained school therapy dog for students to access as part of their support programmes in particular social and emotional needs.

The leadership structure of the school includes the Leadership team, comprising the Principal, the PYP Coordinator and other staff members. Each of these leadership positions attracted varying leadership points. We continue to staff a Chaplain under the Chaplaincy program. At this point in time, Our Saviour Lutheran School does not employ any indigenous staff, teaching or otherwise.

Student non-attendance is managed in a number of ways. Parents may contact the school via phone, email or via school SEESAW app. A daily roll call is completed within each classroom prior to 9am and documented in the class roll book. Absences are written down on a return slip and then sent to the Front Office by a child where an electronic copy is maintained. If the school does not receive a phone call or electronic notification from absent students by 9.30am the school will attempt to contact the family. Children who arrive after the morning bell report directly or with their parent/carer to the Front Office and are recorded as being late.


Although student absenteeism is not currently a concern in the Our Saviour community, in the event of ongoing or regular absences, the classroom teacher addresses the concern with the parents. If the concern continues the principal makes contact with families to discuss the family circumstances and any support that may be required. As parents are required by law to provide the school with a satisfactory explanation as to the reason for their child's absence. In most circumstances, this is all the intervention that is required and is quite effective in curtailing any potential issues in this area.

On rare occasions when unexplained absences are extremely high, the matter is deemed urgent may need to be followed up with a Mandatory Notification or the truancy officer notified. The school has also assisted families with external agencies when the need has presented itself. It must be acknowledged that a many of our families take their annual leave during term time to visit family overseas.

**Reports on a National Scale**

**Parent/Staff and Student Satisfaction**

Throughout our journey of developing our school strategic plan, parent feedback identified that they valued our desire to purposefully deliver educational excellence through our IB PYP programme

however also appreciated that this was well balanced with working together with them in the development of their child as a whole, including social, emotional and spiritual development. Parents and staff saw strength in the school's 'Clan' mentality where it was a whole school approach where students, staff and parents work together for the benefit of all students here at Our Saviour Primary. We have a very active and supportive Parent Governing Body as well as a committed Parents and Friends group that provide several activities like school discos and gourmet evenings where students, families and staff can together grow and blossom as a Christian learning community. Parents and staff also value the close relationship with Our Saviour Lutheran Church including combined events like Connect Events that are planned collaboratively for the wider community throughout each year. Our students have been active in the development of student voice and advocacy and feel empowered and valued. COVID-19 did again impact on our ability to build community together physically however have continued to develop other ways through social media and through the introduction of our 'Stay and Play' afternoons each term to strengthen our connection with each other.
